FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

A five-year Trustee seat on the Library Board of Trustees is about to expire. This position will be filled by an election in January 2017. Trustee Tracy Stapleton was elected to the Board in January 2011 for one year and then re-elected to a five-year term in 2012. She is eligible for re-election. Interested persons may pick up an application at the Circulation Desk. The completed application must include a resume, a written letter of interest and a written petition. Previous experience in libraries or library governance is helpful.

Voting will be by paper ballot at the Annual Meeting on Wednesday, January 11, 2017 from 10:00 AM-9:00 PM. Meet the Candidates Night: Monday, December 19 at 6:30 PM

To be eligible for consideration as a candidate or to vote in the election, a person must be a member of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association; that is, you must be a resident of Union Free School District #6 and have a Library card in good standing. 

Following our tour we visit Grounds for Sculpture a 42-acre sculpture park and museum located on the former site of the New Jersey State Fairgrounds. The grounds have nearly three hundred large-scale contemporary sculptures with works by American and international artists. Lunch will be at their restaurant which has a Claude Monet-styled atmosphere with impressionist-inspired sculptures.
