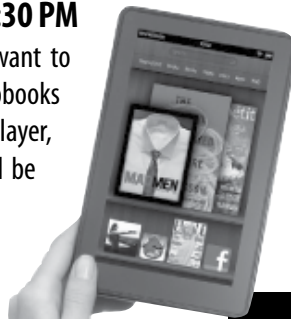
June is Audiobook Month
