From the Board of Trustees

The Library Trustees have announced that one 5-year trustee term on the Board is expiring in January 2019. An additional 4-year seat will be vacated. Both seats will be filled by an election during the Annual Meeting on Wednesday, January 09, 2019. Trustee Christian Neubert was appointed in 2013 and was elected in 2014. He is eligible for re-election. Interested persons are invited to apply. Applications are available at the Library Circulation Desk. Completed application must include a resume, a written statement of interest, and a written petition signed by at least twenty- ve (25) members of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association.

Voting will be by paper ballot at the Annual Meeting on Wednesday, January 9, 2019 from 10:00 AM - 9:00 PM

Absentee ballots will be available at the Circulation Desk from 12/07/2018 to 1/08/2019.

To be eligible for consideration as a candidate or to vote in the election a person must be a member of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association; that is, he or she must be a resident of Union Free School District #6 and have a Library card in good standing. In addition, he or she must be at least 18 years old.
