Annual Meeting and Trustee Election

Wednesday, January 13, 2016 from 10:00 AM- 9:00 PM

Two five-year seats on the Library Board of Trustees are due to expire, and will be filled by an election on January 13, 2016 during the Annual Meeting. Trustees Laura Hill Timpanaro and Susan Prechtl-Loper's seats are expiring. Both Trustees are eligible for re-election. An additional vacated seat for a two-year term will also be filled during this election.

To be eligible to vote in the election, you must be a member of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association; that is, a resident of Union Free School District #6 and have a Library card in good standing. In addition you must be at least 18 years of age.

The Following Candidates will be Running for the PJFL Board of Trustees:

Susan Prechtl-Loper (Incumbent)

A graduate of Earl L.Vandermeulen High School, and a member of the Port Jefferson Library for fifty-two years. My ties include many years of professional employment in the surrounding hospitals and local healthcare facilities, membership of the P.J. United Methodist Church, and volunteer work in the public schools and the PJFD.

The past two years as trustee has been an enlightening learning experience resulting in growth and development in library governance and trusteeship. I have shared the goal of improving and extending library services during partnership with the Board and Director. I have attended workshops, participated in the policy committee and most recently taken on the role of Financial Officer.

I remain confident that I have the assets and professional skills necessary to be re-elected as a Trustee and believe I can humbly continue to make significant contributions to enhance the future success of the Port Jefferson Free Library.

As a Trustee of the Port Jefferson Library from 1994 to 1999, I was involved in multiple projects including the creation of the Children's Library and the Adult Reading Room. This experience gave me a strong understanding of the building development, fiscal requirements and challenges, and in the process helped me gain a solid understanding of the village population's needs and

I welcome the opportunity to support the Library's current goals and initiatives. Once again, it would be an honor to work with the library's administration and its outstanding staff.




Joel Rosenthal


I hope you will consider voting for me so I may continue on this path of good work because I truly love the library.




WINTER READING PROGRAM 2016
