FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Library Trustees have announced that two Trustee seats on the Library Board are due to expire and new five year terms will be filled by an election during the Annual Meeting to be held on Wednesday, January 10, 2018. Trustees Lisa Ballou and Joel Rosenthal's terms are expiring and they are eligible to seek re-election. Interested persons are invited to apply. Applications are available at the Circulation Desk. The completed application is due by November 10th and must include a resume, a written statement of interest, and a written petition signed by at least twenty-five (25) members of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association.

Voting will be by paper ballot at the Annual Meeting on Wednesday, January 10, 2018 from 10:00 AM - 9:00 PM

To be eligible for consideration as a candidate or to vote in the election a person must be a member of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association; that is, he or she must be a resident of Union Free School District #6 and have a Library card in good standing. In addition, he or she must be at least 18 years old.
