

The completed application is due by November 10th and must include a resume, a written statement of interest, and a written petition signed by at least twenty-five (25) members of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association.

Voting will be by paper ballot at the Annual Meeting on Wednesday, January 10, 2018 from 10:00 AM - 9:00 PM

To be eligible for consideration as a candidate or to vote in the election a person must be a member of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association; that is, he or she must be a resident of Union Free School District #6 and have a Library card in good standing. In addition, he or she must be at least 18 years old.




