Trip begins with a guided tour of The Morgan Library & Museum a complex of buildings in the heart of New York City. Designed by the architectural firm McKim, Mead & White between 1902 & 1906, this was the private library of financier Pierpont Morgan. Majestic in appearance the result was an Italian Renaissance-style palazzo with three magnificent rooms holding a collection of illuminated, literary, and historical manuscripts, early printed books, and old master drawings and prints. In 1928, the Annex building was erected and connected to the McKim library by means of a gallery and in 1988, Morgan's former residence, on Madison Avenue and 37th Street, also was added to the complex. The largest expansion in the Morgan's history, adding 75,000 square feet to the campus, was completed in 2006. Next it is lunch, in a private room, at the Empire State Building restaurant the STATE Grill & Bar. Following lunch see the newly restored lobby with its stunning art deco ceiling murals and visit the historical Dare To Dream Exhibit, and the Sustainability Exhibit. Trip also includes admission to the Main Deck 86th Floor Observatory.the highest open-air observatory in New York.
