Designed by the architectural firm McKim, Mead & White between 1902 & 1906, this was the private library of financier Pierpont Morgan. Majestic in appearance the result was an Italian Renaissance-style palazzo with three magnificent rooms holding a collection of illuminated, literary, and historical manuscripts, early printed books, and old master drawings and prints. Next it is lunch, in a private room, at the Empire State Building restaurant the STATE Grill & Bar. Following lunch see the newly restored lobby with its stunning art deco ceiling murals and visit the historical Dare To Dream Exhibit, and the Sustainability Exhibit. Trip also includes admission to the Main Deck 86th Floor Observatory.


