ANNUAL MEETING & TRUSTEE ELECTION

One 5-year trustee term on the Board is expiring in January 2020. This seat will be filled by an election during the Annual Meeting on Wednesday, January 15, 2020. Trustee John Grossman was elected in 2012 and seeking re-election. He will be running unopposed.

Voting will be by paper ballot at the Annual Meeting on WEDNESDAY, January 15, 2020 from 10:00 AM-9:00 PM. Absentee ballots will be available at the Library Circulation Desk from 12/13/2019 to 1/14/2020.

To be eligible to vote in the election, a person must be a member of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association; that is, he or she must be a resident of Union Free School District #6, and have a library card in good standing. In addition, he or she must be at least 18 years old.




