

ANNUAL MEETING & TRUSTEE ELECTION Wednesday, January 11, 2023 10:00 AM - 9:00 PM

The Library Trustees have announced two five-year seats on the Board are due to expire and will be filled by an election during the Annual Meeting by paper ballot. Absentee ballots will be available at the Circulation Desk until January 10, 2023. Incumbent Joseph Orofino. elected in 2019 to a fouryear seat, will be seeking re-election along with one other applicant who has filed a petition. Joel Rosenthal, elected in 2016, will not be seeking re-election. The Library is most appreciative of his service and wishes him happiness in his future endeavors.

To be eligible for consideration as a candidate or to vote in the election, a person must be at least 18 years old, a member of the Port Jefferson Free Library Association; that is, he or she must be a resident of Union Free School District #6, and have a Library card in good standing.



Joseph is a lifelong resident of Port Jefferson. He began his tenure as a Trustee in January 2019 and has been serving as Financial Officer since 2020. Joseph is a financial services executive with over 20 years of experience and is currently the Head of Fixed Income at Nassau Financial Group and part of its executive team. Serving on the Board has been a rewarding experience and enabled him to bring his experienced financial opinion to help set budgets and ensure they remain on track, as well as making sure tax dollars are used effectively.
