rom sold out bus trips and popular cooking classes, to DIY kits flying off the shelves, you have participated in many wonderful, engaging events and programs. You have been with us every step of the way and it is you, our patrons, who make it possible for the Library to provide you with the materials and resources you request and use.

For the second consecutive year, we have been designated a five-star library by the Library Journal Index of Public Library Service, and only one of three five-star libraries in our size category nationwide. This is all due to your patronage. Thank you for letting us be part of your lives and part of this wonderful community!

The Main Library: Our Library is a community center and much more! Over the course of the last year, visitors walked through our doors over 97,162 times and borrowed 207,415 items. Library staff answered over 45,767 questions and conducted 1,920 programs, hosting 66,044 individuals. Our Games and Gadgets collection is always growing and the Helping Hands program has assisted many patrons get the necessary services that they require.

When we were not welcoming visitors through our doors, we attended back-to-school nights, PTA events, and book clubs. The Library also provides a home delivery service for those who are homebound. We partnered with local school districts and nursery schools, the Rotary Club of Port Jefferson, as well as the Port Jefferson Chamber of Commerce and other local civic associations. You will also see us at local events like the Dicken's Festival, Health and Wellness, the Dragon Boat Races, and more.

This year the demand for passport services has increased with over 620 passports processed. If you are getting a new passport or need a new photograph for a renewal, you can make an appointment with one of our passport agent librarians. This very successful program allows you to sit oneon-one with a Librarian who will guide you through the entire process of applying for or renewing a passport. **Teen Center:** We are beyond bursting at the seams! The Teen Center had 2,908 teens attending 256 programs, and ran over 61 community service programs, with 1,076 teens attending and receiving community service credit. When teens cannot come into the Teen Center, they can still access Homework Help, SAT prep, and other valuable services on our website. We are proud to provide a safe spot for our teens to learn, socialize, and relax! We currently rent the space for the Teen Center shown in the budget as "Facilities Rental". We are asking for \$48,500.00 to continue to run the Teen Center while we work on our permanent facility.

Stop the "Summer Slide": Research continues to show the negative impact the "summer slide" has on reading and math skills learned during the school year, however, when a child reads as few as eight books during summer break, there is no loss. The 440 children who participated in the Library's Summer Reading Program enjoyed 111 programs, for a total attendance of 1,975. They went back to school prepared for the new year while having fun during the summer reading program. Over the rest of the year, 5,201 children attended an additional 466 programs and checked out 69,086 items, this is a real tribute to our incredible Children's Department!

Building Operations and Maintenance: Over the past year we have had two major upgrades to the building. Our lights have been converted to LED, saving us money on utility bills. We also installed a new roof, which is expected to last 30 years or more. We thank you for all your patience while these projects were being completed!

To maintain the building, the Library proposes \$314,750 needed for equipment and maintenance. This covers equipment necessary to maintain the building such as cleaning supplies, snow removal, fall cleanup, sanitizing bathrooms, copier machine rentals, as well as equipment purchases and replacements. Equipment includes everything from brooms and shovels to computers, light fixtures, printers, scanners, tables, chairs, shelving, and other items that are necessary to run the Library.

A Virtual Branch with Real Assets: To make the Library's vast resources readily available 24/7, we have a streamlined, user friendly website. Our "digital portal" is chock-full with almost a million items cataloged, databases of information you cannot find anywhere else, direct access to your account, discounted travel opportunities, free museum passes, and much more. With services such as Flipster, Kanopy, and Hoopla, we now offer over 700,000 movies, e-books, emagazines, and music for you to download anytime from anywhere, even from your mobile device.

What is going to happen to the Cottage and the green space? Our green space is coming into fruition! We have our plans, contractors, and all permits needed to convert the empty lot into a usable green space for Library programs, events, or for patrons to relax outside in nice weather. We hope to have a ribbon cutting ceremony this spring!

Over at 205 East Main Street ("the Scented Cottage"), we have been working on finalizing the plans to turn the space into our Teen Center. We are planning to maintain the historic nature of the house while making sure our visitors and staff are safe. Once completed, this will give our award-winning Teen Center more opportunities to continue their innovative services and programming.

You have supported us with your visits and engaged with us for so many programs and classes. Now we ask you to support us by voting yes on the budget. We are faced with a 2.0% tax cap, which means that while Library usage increases, we cannot increase our operating budget. Your Library consistently strives to deliver the valuable services our Village needs and deserves, but we need your help. For pennies more a week, you can ensure that the Library will continue to be a vital contributor to the Village's quality of life.
