Citizen Science: Horseshoe Crab Count Families with children 5 years and older Wednesday, April 5 10:00 AM

You've probably seen horseshoe crabs: those large, leggy, prehistoric looking scavengers in the waters around Long Island. Unfortunately, they are now listed as "vulnerable" on the Red List of Endangered Species, due to habitat loss, changing climate, and overfishing. In May and early June, horseshoe crab surveys are conducted by organizations to monitor and assess the health of local crab populations. Those organizations rely on "Citizen Scientists" of all ages who join them.
