His presentation will detail the life cycle of quail, their ecology, why the project was begun in 2003, and how it can help our environment and community as well as information about the public release of the mature birds.





To contact us about your donations, please stop by the book shop. We request approximately 30 or fewer books for each donation (one box at a time). In a container that you can carry into the bookshop, staff and volunteers are unable to get items from vour vehicle.

Books we DO ACCEPT: We welcome most book genres-Adult Classics, Children's and Young Adult Books, Biographies and Memoirs, Business Books, Cookbooks, Fiction (our bestselling category and the books we need the most), Graphic Novels and Manga, History and Politics, Home and Garden, Mysteries and Thrillers.
