May 1, 2025 marks 100 years of the Port Jefferson Free Library at 100 Thompson Street.

The Library started in 1908 with a small group of women from Port Jefferson forming the Literary Society to organize a public library collection in a room above the C.F. Robbins grocery store at East Broadway and East Main. The library moved to a couple of interim rental locations before the purchase of our present property and the construction of the main room and basement which opened to the public a century ago. Those spaces are still used today and form the foundation off which additions and renovations led to our current footprint.

May 1st, we celebrate a century of service at 100 Thompson Street. Here's to the next 100!
